Reporting to a Unit Supervisor, these positions are designed to provide assistance and support to Child Protection workers in the Intake (1), Family Services (1) and Children's Services(1) Departments.

Main responsibilities include: driving children/parents to appointments; facilitating access visits between children and parents when required; interviewing parents and children to obtain information to assist Child Protection Worker's prepare health; social histories, record/file reviews; assists in the preparation of file materials for disclosure for court; accompanies parents or children to court and provides support to them where necessary; researches and completes community service referral forms; performs other duties as assigned.

The successful candidate will be enrolled in a Bachelor of Social Work or Master of Social Work program from a recognized university and returning to school in the Fall of 2017 on a full-time basis; demonstrated ability to write clear, concise reports, computer literate and familiarity with spreadsheet programs; excellent communication, interpersonal and analytical skills. The successful candidate must possess a valid G driver's license; have access to a personal vehicle and proof of \$2,000,000 liability insurance coverage. Successful candidate will be required to provide a Criminal Reference Check, satisfactory to the Agency, and a Driver's Abstract from the Ministry of Transportation.
